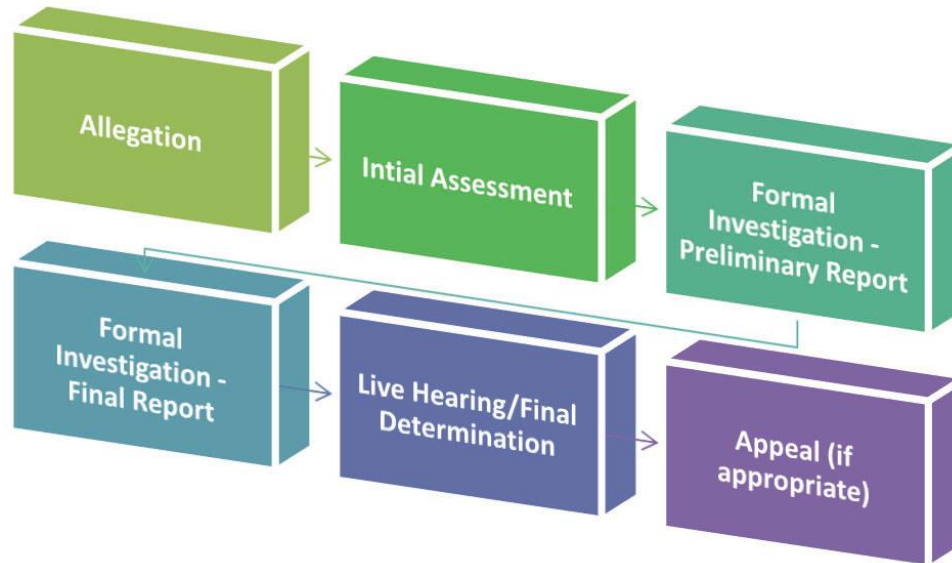


QUICK SUMMARY OF THE TITLE IX PROCESS

While we encourage you to read the entirety of the Title IX/SB 493 document, the following points are meant to highlight the main components of the process. Again, this is NOT a substitute for the official Title IX/SB 493 document.

- There is no time limit for the filing of a Complaint of Sexual Discrimination or Sexual Violence;
- To start the process, you must file a “Formal Complaint” using the appropriate form (see link below);
- All parties involved in a Title IX complaint will need to be present during a live hearing conducted via Zoom (this includes the complainant and respondent);
- All parties involved have a right to an advisor – this advisor may be an attorney;
- All parties must submit to cross-examination during the live hearing; and
- The process may feel slow as there are numerous steps, each with their own timeframe (see below):
